# **Mathematical Development**

Our main focus for term 1 will be number and counting.

Reception - will be learning to count up to 10 objects accurately, as well as developing their recognition of these numbers. Please help your child at home by spotting numbers and counting things everywhere you go! They will be learning to compare groups of objects and identifying which group has the most or least.

Year 1 – will be ensuring our number knowledge is secure to 20, reading and writing and counting objects accurately. We will then progress to addition and subtraction. The Year 1 children will use concrete apparatus to help them add and subtract 1- and 2-digit numbers.

We will then move onto 2D shapes, learning to sort them, name them and talk about how many sides and corners they have.

### **PSED**

In PSED we will be developing our circle time skills, and getting to know our new class friends. We will be talking about how we feel at different times at school and working together to write a set of 'Robin's Rules'.

### Art and DT

This term we will start by making a self-portrait in mixed media for our class wall. Moving on to looking at Castles: printing a castle using different shapes, creating our own mini and large shared junk model castles. At Halloween we will be making observational pumpkin drawings and colour mixing oranges inside! Of course, we will enjoy making oil pastel and glitter firework pictures. We can use our Autumn treasures to make collages in the style of Andrew Goldsworthy.

**Reception Phonics** -We will be learning the individual letter sounds, using sounds, pictures and actions. I will be sending home the sounds each day for you to practise. Please help your child become familiar with recognising the lower case letter shapes, and try and find things that begin with the letter sound.

As we learn individual letter sounds, we will begin to blend sounds to read small 2 and 3 letter words.

Our Topic is 'Dragons and Princesses!'

Key Question: What Happened in a Castle? Year 1 Phonics -Phonic sessions will happen daily and children will be ensuring they have secure knowledge of their Phase 3 digraphs and moving onto phase 4. We will be playing games to support reading and focussing on our keywords. Year 1 will also be focusing on letter formation.

# Language and Literacy

This term we will be reading stories about knights, dragons, castles, princesses, kings and queens! Our key text is Zog by Julia Donaldson and we will enjoy lots of supporting dragon and castle stories and non-fiction texts.

The Reception children will be focusing on identifying initial sounds for words. We will be writing our names and trying to recognise our friend's names too! As well as developing our small hand muscles to support our pencil control for writing.

Year 1 children will be writing in different styles and focusing on writing sentences with increasing independence and remembering Capital letters, finger spaces and full stops!

### **Physical Development**

In PE this term, we will be focussing on developing movement and coordination. We will be exploring multi skills activities to develop balance, spatial awareness, agility and coordination. This will include building obstacle courses, team games like stuck in the mud and jumping beans. We will also develop our ball skills including rolling, throwing and catching.

# Our Topic Is: Knights, Dragons and Princesses!

Through our topic we will be historians: looking at what happened in castles, who lived in them and using artefacts, photographs and paintings to learn more about the past. We will also have a focus on Guy Fawkes as a character from the past.

In Science, we will look at the human body, our senses and body parts associated with these. Our investigation will be 'What shall we use to build our castle?' Looking at the properties of different materials. We will also be exploring the world around us and noticing seasonal changes.

After half term, we will continue to learn about celebrations and traditions through the Hindu celebration of Diwali and of course we finish with Christmas and the Nativity story!
