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Dear Parents and Carers.

A warm welcome to our second school Newsletter of Term 2. In spite of the national lockdown, we have lots of Plumpton School goings-on to share with you.

Attendance

Attendance at Plumpton Primary School currently stands at 96.6% this term and very close to the Local Authority target of 97%. This week's attendance winners are Kingfisher Class with an impressive 97% attendance record this term. **Well done Kingfishers.**

As before, please note that your child does not need a Covid-19 test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell (and do not have a temperature, a new continuous cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste) because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.

Progress toward our SDP

This year the principal focus of our *School Development Plan* (SDP) is ensuring our pupils **catch-up** following the disruption to their learning in the summer months. This means that we are continuing to promote **the very best attendance**, as well as using our Catch-up Funding from the Government to address gaps that have formed in the children's understanding (particularly in Maths and English). In addition, this year we are also focusing on: Maths (and the continued use of Times Tables Rockstars), Writing, Sporting opportunities and the continued promotion of Kindness.

Food vouchers

We understand that these are difficult times for some families, so Plumpton Primary School would like to let you know that we can offer – or put you in contact with those who can offer – **food vouchers** to any families that find themselves in need of extra support. School and Eco-Council update

This past fortnight our School and Eco Councils have been focusing on reducing our school's carbon footprint by nominating light monitors. For safety, our School and Eco councils will continue to meet in Key, , Stage bubbles.

Take One Treasure update

Our topic this term is *Take One Treasure*, and, in recent weeks, our Lapwings and Robins pupils have been exploring the history of *Toys* throughout time while working on observing change through time and on sequencing events in history. Further up the school, in Woodpecker Class, pupils have been delving into all things *Egyptian* and comparing this ancient civilisation's customs to ours in 2020. The Kingfishers have been exploring the *Vikings* and have been applying what they know from their study of pirates to better understand these marauding invaders. Finally, our Owls have been analysing the history of the *Aztecs*, a civilisation which ruled much of modern-day Mexico at the same time as the Tudors ruled England.





Digital Leaders update

Plumpton Primary School can now proudly boast that it has *Digital Leaders* amongst its pupil body. This past fortnight our digital leaders have met with Miss Oakes – our Computing leader at our school – and have discussed their roles and responsibilities in class as well as what initiatives they will spearhead in order to improve Computing (and E-Safety) at Plumpton Primary School.


Emotional Health and Wellbeing update - SENCo

In addition, please see below for a reminder of the measures we are implementing to help prevent the potential spread of the Coronavirus:

- Pupils will arrive at school and leave school according to the staggered times;
- Indoors, pupils will remain in consistent class bubbles throughout the school day;
- Pupils will play in year group bubbles and in zones during play times and lunch times;
- Breakfast Club will be limited to 15 children, and must be booked in advance;
- G-Suite log-ins have been provided in case of localised/national lockdowns in the future;
- Children will be prioritised for testing should they display any symptoms;
- Classrooms will be well-ventilated;
- Children will wash their hands frequently throughout the day, including on arrival at school, before home time and between sessions;
- Cleaning staff will clean the school site at the beginning of the day and in the middle of the day, with a particular focus on high-touch areas such as switches, door handles and tables;
- Visitors will wear masks in communal areas of the school.
- **NEW** measures:
 - School Staff will wear face coverings on the school gate and the beginning and end of the day;
 - It is recommended that parents and carers, when dropping-off and pickingup, also wear face coverings.
