Definition of Landscape

Landscape comprises the visible features of an area of land, including the physical elements of landforms such as (ice-capped) mountains, hills, water bodies and living elements of land cover.

FNGLISH

In term 5 and 6 we will be studying a mixture of fiction and non - fiction texts that are linked to our project work 'Landscapes'. We will be considering the question 'What is the purpose of art?' and as part of our work we shall be studying 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan and thinking about what is beautiful to one person may not have the same significance to another. Our writing focus will include writing in role as the main character in 'The Lost Thing' and writing explanation texts, biographies and an autobiography linked to the artists and artwork that we are studying. As part of our whole class reading, we will be studying 'The Lady of Shalott' and considering the landscape that the poem is set in. We will read a wide range of texts - fiction and non-fiction - to practise reading for different purposes and to identify themes and conventions within these texts. These texts will form the basis and inspiration for our writing and be used to extend vocabulary. We will also focus on specific grammar and punctuation, applying them to the different genres that we are writing. We will practise spelling in class and focus on different spelling rules each week. Children's understanding of grammar, punctuation and vocabulary will be developed throughout the year during all topics and handwriting will be practised frequently.

ART & DT

In Art we will be studying a variety of artists that have been inspired to create landscapes and experimenting with the techniques (line, space, value, form, colour, shape and texture) that they have used to create our own images. We will research biographies for each artist and write explanations of the techniques that they have used. We will be working in our beautiful sketch books and working towards a final exhibition of our work.

MUSIC

In Music we will be using percussion instruments, listening to a wide variety of music, studying the musical elements: pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture and silence and considering how they can be organised within musical structure and used to communicate different moods and effects. We will be exploring and explaining our own ideas and feelings about music and researching different musicians and how they have used the different elements and been inspired by their landscape.

SCIFNCE

This term we will be deepening our understanding about Earth and Space and living things and their habitats. We will be continuing to explore our local area through the seasons and considering the wildlife that lives in our habitat and how we can look after it in the years to come. We will be classifying and creating our own curious creatures and investigating microorganisms and discussing which ones are helpful and others that can be harmful.
